



## **Mutual respect**

Here at Iver Heath Junior School we have 3 Golden Rules, the first of which is '*We treat everyone with respect, honesty and kindness.*' This theme is reiterated often in assemblies which are taken by staff; weekly assemblies where House Captains give out awards and in our Friday Celebration Assembly, where pupils are awarded 'Star of the Week' for reasons which include following the 3 Golden Rules. Posters containing the 3 Golden Rules can be found in every classroom and in various places throughout the school building. Pupils demonstrating respect to their peers, adults or property may be awarded house points by any member of the school staff.

## **Tolerance of those of Different faiths and Beliefs**

At Iver Heath Junior School, we celebrate the culturally rich and diverse society that makes up Britain. Whenever possible we provide pupils with the opportunities to learn from each other by sharing and celebrating their different faiths and cultures. This is done through assembly opportunities where adults and pupils are encouraged to share their own faith and culture to enhance learning. It is also taught explicitly through the curriculum. In RE pupils are taught the similarities and difference between Christianity, Islam, Judaism, Hinduism and Sikhism. Pupils are taught that these religions, among others, are practised in Britain and they learn about what that involves. They are also taught the fundamental need for everyone to uphold respect for the beliefs of each religion.

We have robust policies and procedures for any form of identity-based bullying at Iver Heath Junior School including ethnicity, cultural and religious backgrounds, gender, sexual identity. These have been supported by working with the Equally Safe Project and were written with feedback from our Agents for Change.

At Iver Heath Junior School, it is very important to us that all of our school community including pupils and their families, staff, governors and visitors feel safe, are aware how to be safe, learn respect and tolerance and how these concepts affect our lives locally, nationally and globally and prepare our pupils for life in modern Britain.
