Colons
Use a colon to separate a list of items from the text that follows.
Example: I bought apples, oranges, and bananas.

Semicolons
Use a semicolon to separate two independent clauses that are closely related in thought.
Example: It was raining; we stayed at home.

Dash
Use a dash to indicate a sudden change in direction or a break in the text.
Example: She was walking to school - she saw a dog.

Apoptrophe
Use an apostrophe to show possession or to form contractions.
Example: The cat's tail was long. It's raining.

Quotation Marks
Use quotation marks to enclose direct speech or titles of short works.
Example: "I love reading." she said.

Pronoun
Replace the name of a person or thing with a pronoun.
Example: The dog barked. It was loud.

Preposition
Show the relationship between a noun and another word in a sentence.
Example: The ball is under the table.

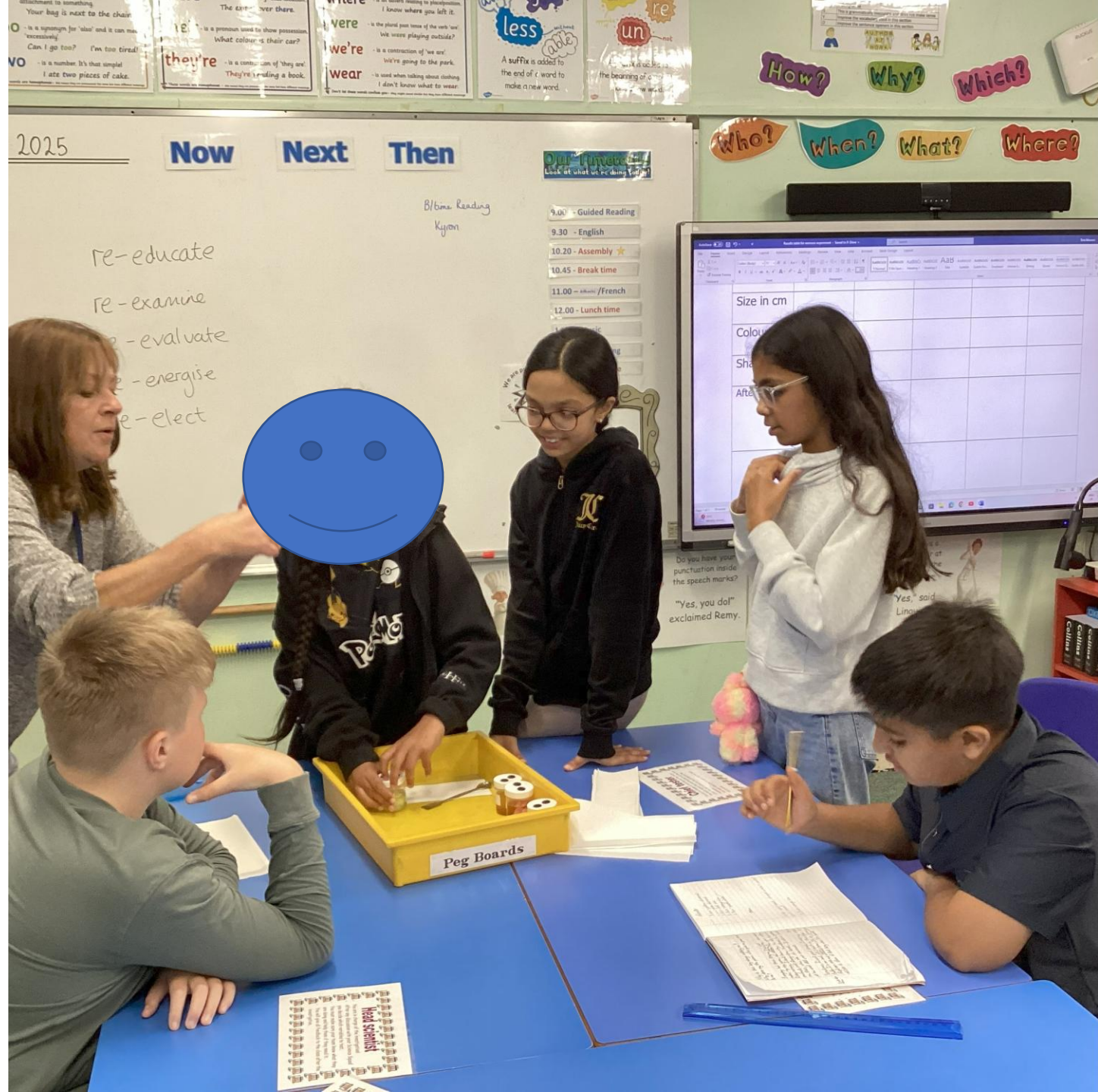

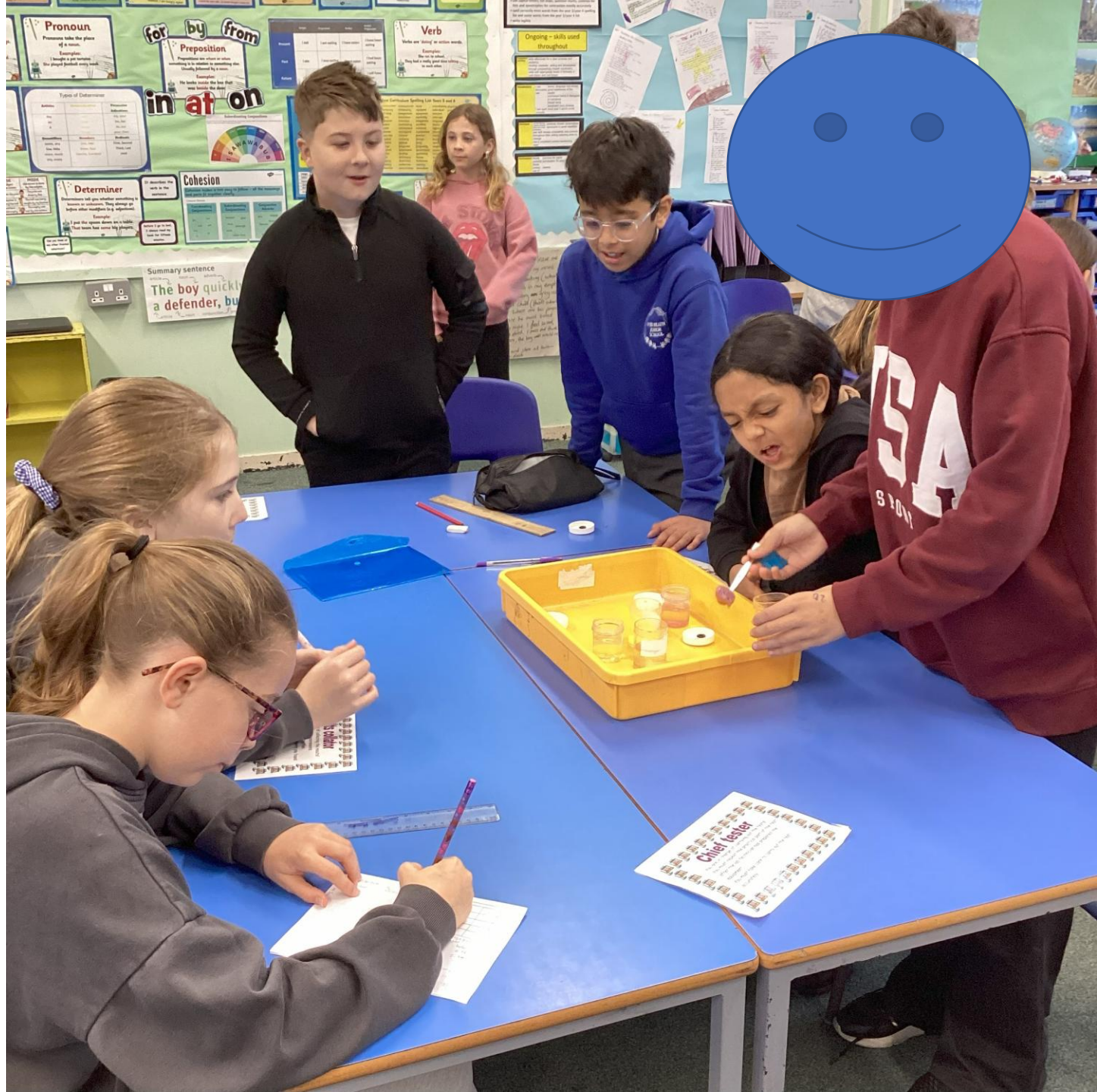

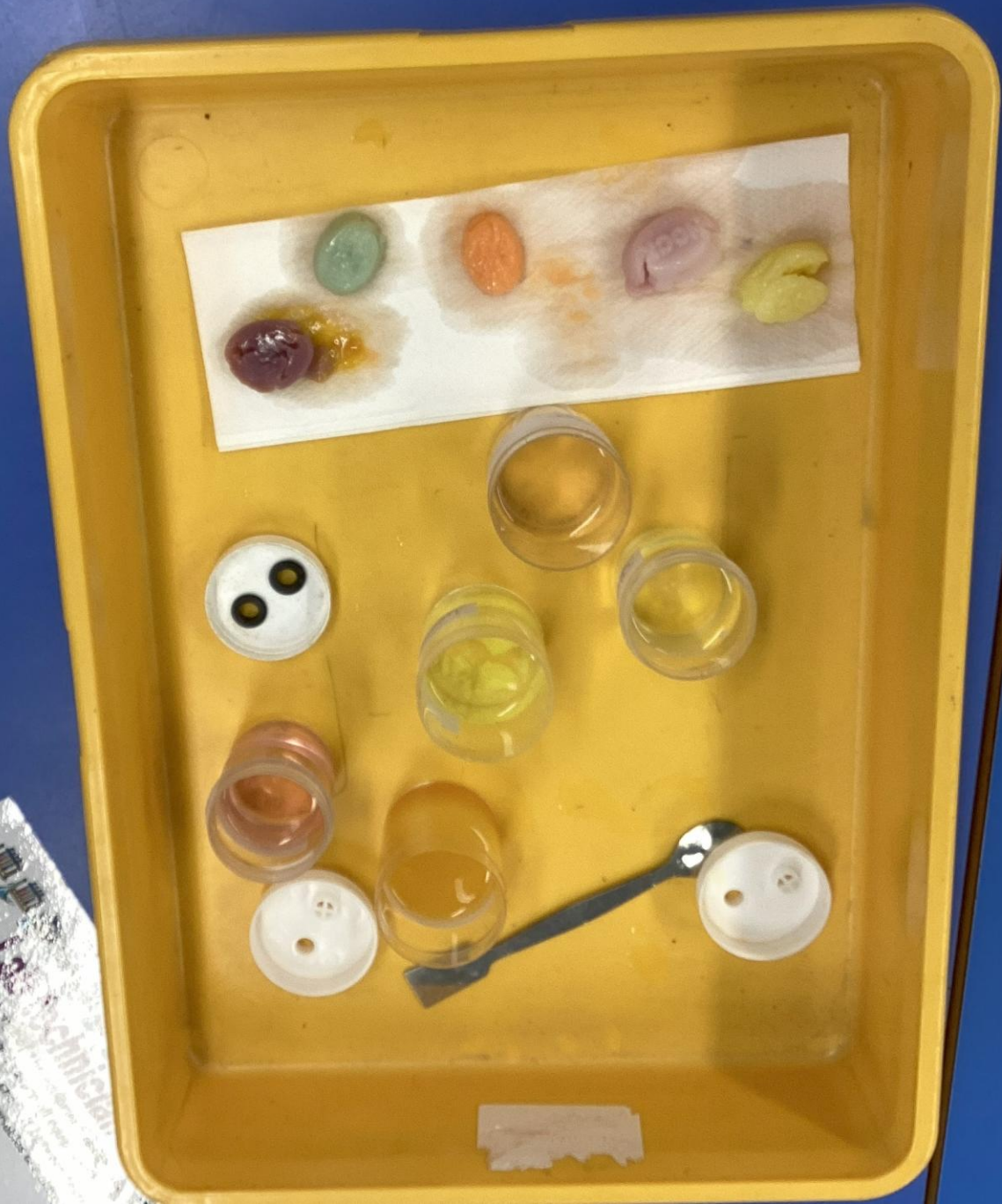
