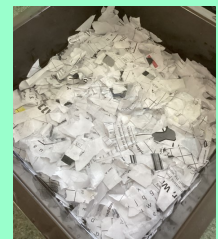


Ash in 5H was proud to let me know he'd got all the stickers on his chart at home for eating all 5 of the featured vegetables.

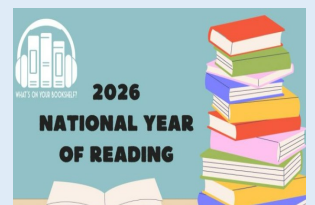
## We Are Readers!
